We adhere to all relevant Acts, and circulars, including Supply Chain Management Circular 5 of 2016/2017, the Broad -Based Black Economic Empowerment Amendment Act, Act No.46 of 2013, Black Economic Empowerment Act 53 of 2003, the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No.5 of 2000 and the Employment Equity Act No. 55 of 1998.

In terms of Preferential Procurement Regulation of January 2017, the department will be applying the 80/20 preference point system. Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) requires that bidders submit original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof to substantiate their B-BBEE rating claims.

PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA FOR PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT

BIDDERS WHO DO NOT MEET THE PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA BELOW, WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FURTHER IN THE EVALUATION PROCESS

The Department has decided to apply pre-qualification criteria, in terms of Preferential Procurement Regulation 4(1)(b) to advance certain designated groups. Only the following tenderers may respond

An EME (Exempted Micro Enterprise) or QSE (Qualifying Small Enterprise)

Qualifying bidders must adhere to the following

- 1. A Bidder who qualifies as an Exempted Micro Enterprises (EME's) must submit a sworn affidavit,
- A Bidder who qualifies as a Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSE's) and is more than 51% black owned must submit a sworn affidavit.
- 3. Sworn affidavits submitted by bidders in support of their B-BBEE level should comply with the DTI or the CIPC format or in a similar format and must be valid, original or certified as a true copy of the original.
- 4. A Bidder who qualifies as a Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSE's) and is less than 51% black owned must submit a B-BBEE verification certificate issued by an Agency accredited by SANAS (South African National Accreditation System) which must be valid, original or certified as a true copy of the original.
- A trust, consortium or joint venture (including unincorporated consortia and joint ventures) must submit a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate issued by an Agency accredited by SANAS (South African National Accreditation System) for every separate tender.

Bidders who fail to submit a valid original or certified copy of their B-BBEE Certificate or Sworn Affidavit will result in the bidder being disqualified. Sworn Affidavits and certification as a "true copy of the original", must comply with the requirements outlined in the Justices of the Peace and Commissioners of Oaths Act, No 16 of 1963 and its Regulations promulgated in Government Notice GNR 1258 of 21 July 1972 Justices of the Peace and Commissioners of Oaths Act, No. 16 of 1963.

NB: The submission of a fraudulent B-BBEE certificate will result in the bidder being disqualified and criminal proceedings being instituted against the bidder. The bidder, the shareholders and / or directors will further be restricted from doing business with any organ of the state for a maximum period of 10 years

COMPULSORY/MANDATORY TENDER REQUIREMENTS:

Failure to submit the following required documents will render the bidders tender disqualified:

- Proof of current CIDB grading of 5 CE or higher & 6CE or higher depending on relevant tender number
- The safety officer must be registered and in a good standing with SACPCMP as a construction health and safety
 officer (CHSO). The prospective bidders must submit proof of registration with the mentioned professional bodies.
 Recently certified copies (within 3 months of tender closing) of the professional registration certificate indicating the
 applicable registration number must be attached/ submitted as part of bidders' tender documents
- Complete, sign and submit all compulsory SBD documents which form part of the tender document.
- Bidders must attend the compulsory site briefing as indicated above. The attendance register must be completed and will be used as proof of your attendance.

NB: Bidders who are listed on the National Treasury's register of defaulters and restricted suppliers will be automatically disqualified.

OTHER KEY RETURNABLES:

- Valid Tax Clearance and/or Tax registration pin code.
- Registration Documents of the business with the Companies and Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC) OR Master of the High Court in South Africa.
- Certified ID Copies of company members and shareholders (NB: the date of certification must be less than 3 months from the date of the bid closure).

Bidders may bid for more than one tender provided qualifying conditions as stipulated are satisfied. Where more than one bid is tendered for, bidders may submit only one set of returnable documents.

NB: A bidder who scores the highest on points for price and preference will not be awarded more than two (2) bills of quantity (contracts). The two (2) bills awarded will be the bills with the highest rand value in which the bidder was ranked first. The remaining bills will be awarded (maximum of two (2) per bidder) in terms of the bidder's ranking on points. The rand value of the bills awarded to all subsequent bidders, will be based on the same principle applied to the bidder that was ranked first.

Functionality will be scored out of 100 points and the minimum threshold to qualify is 60 points. Bidders who fail to meet the minimum threshold will not be considered for further evaluation. The evaluation criteria to score bidders on functionality is as follows:

Key personnel (Max 30 points) Bidders MUST complete the Experience of Key Staff schedule attached in the tender document for key personnel and MUST clearly indicate routine road maintenance or road rehabilitation and/or road construction experience, project description, duration and contactable references. NB: (Failure to complete and submit certified qualifications will result in the bidder getting zero points)	Relevant Company experience in Routine Road Maintenance or Road Rehabilitation & Construction. (Max 40 points) (Fallure to submit required completion certificates will result in the bidder getting zero points) NB: Completion certificates must be signed by all relevant parties (Certificate that is not signed by all relevant parties will result in the bidder forfelting points) NB: Practical completion certificate will not be accepted. Bidders should note the following:

- Where the proposed prices of critical materials to be supplied to the Department are considerably less than the
 expected market price or rates, the Department reserves the right to verify the proposed prices by requesting
 quotations from the supplier(s) cited in the compilation of the bid.
- Only suppliers who are registered on the National Centralized Supplier Database (CSD) will be considered for appointment.
- The bid validity period is 90 days. However, the Department reserves the right to request all bidders to extend such validity period should the need arise.
- Prospective bidders should be represented at the compulsory briefing session by suitable/qualified and experienced
 individuals who can fully comprehend the scope and complexities of the work involved.
- The successful bidder will be required to enter into a formal contract with the Department. Such contract will be governed in terms of the FIDIC Conditions of Contract (1990)
- 5% Performance Guarantee will be payable by the successful bidder within 14 days after awarding of the tender.
- The Department will not compensate the bidder for any costs incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid
 offer, including the costs of any testing necessary to demonstrate that aspect of the offer complies with requirements.
 - NB: Potential suppliers must note that in terms of departmental policy, the Department reserves the right to cancel and blacklist any supplier for a period of at least 12 months if the supplier fails to adequately perform in terms of the awarded contract.
