

Futuristic, world-class NuMeRI centre sets Steve Biko Academic Hospital apart in Africa

The Nuclear Medicine Research Infrastructure (NuMeRI) centre housed at the Steve Biko Academic Hospital (SBAH) in Pretoria has propelled the healthcare facility into a league of its own in the area of nuclear medicine and research in Africa.

Professor Mike Sathekge said the futuristic infrastructure will help improve the quality of life and extend the lifespan and overall survival of cancer patients using radiopharmaceuticals. "We are currently in a position to do clinical trials that will help us develop and have access to new treatment for conditions that are difficult to treat." The establishment of this facility marks a significant milestone in the field of nuclear medicine, pushing the boundaries of what was previously thought to be impossible. Its presence not only enhances the medical capabilities within Gauteng province but also elevates the provincial status as a leader in healthcare innovation and excellence."



The half a billion-rand NuMeRI facility is part of the Department of Science and Technology's South African Research Infrastructure Roadmap (SARIR) and is a one-stop-shop medical nuclear imaging and theragnostic facility dedicated to drug development and clinical research for the benefit of the South African, African and global health care sector. In addition, local drug researchers, medical practitioners, and international collaborators will also benefit from NuMeRI.

The facility's main purpose is to facilitate research, innovation and value generation in areas of country and region-specific health challenges. Some of the functions that the NuMeRI centre will offer include clinical unit, radio pharmacy, basic and translational research, preclinical imaging, node of infection imaging and medical physics and radiobiology unit.

Reflecting on the NuMeRI centre during her oversight visit on Thursday, 07 March 2024, Gauteng MEC for Health and Wellness, Nomantu Nkomo-Ralehoko said, the establishment of this facility marks a significant milestone in the field of nuclear medicine, pushing the boundaries of what was previously thought to be impossible. "Its presence not only enhances the medical capabilities within Gauteng province but also elevates the provincial status as a leader in healthcare innovation and excellence."

The MEC said that the department is very proud to have a state-of-art facility in one of the iconic hospitals such as SBAH. 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Regained eyesight leads to new found independence for 92-year-old man

Having lived for over 9 decades, Khukhuza Esau Mdhluli of Wattville near Benoni has overcome many adversities in his lifetime but it is his recent triumph that has rekindled hope and restored his independence.

The a 92-year-old elderly man, cannot not stop expressing his gratitude to the Ophthalmology team at Tambo Memorial Hospital for the work they did in helping to restore his gift of vision.

In a display of thankfulness for heartfelt compassion and medical excellence, Mdhluli recently paid a special visit to Tambo Memorial Hospital to personally thank Dr Agnes Risko Kenyeres, the esteemed Head of Ophthalmology at the facility for the profound impact of her work.

Mdhluli had embarked on a journey from darkness back into the light, overcoming blindness under Dr Kenyeres and her team's expert care. The elderly man thanked the team for their timeous interventions that enabled him to have his eyesight restored thus improving his well-being.

From their first meeting, Dr. Kenyeres recognised the urgency of Mdhluli's situation and immediately scheduled him for cataract surgery. His right eye was operated in July 2023 as part of the Gauteng Department of Health's surgical marathon campaign. This marked beginning of his remarkable recovery. A similar procedure on his left eye completed the transformation fully restoring his sight.

Dr Kenyeres, who received the Lifetime Humanitarian Award from the Ophthalmological Society of South Africa (OSSA) in 2023 at their 55th annual national congress in Durban, KwaZulu-Natal, has shown unwavering commitment to advancing eye health and enhancing the wellbeing of her patients in the Ekurhuleni community. Aiming to perform up to 75 cataract operations a month, she is making a significant difference in the lives of many.

In response to the gratitude expressed by her patients, Dr Kenyeres remained humble. "I am overwhelmed but I know I couldn't have done this without my team and the unwavering support of the hospital management. Seeing our patients regain their ability to live fully through the restoration of their sight is rewarding," she commented.

Another patient who further testified of the impact the work of Dr Kenyeres and he team on him is Kenneth Musi. He praised Dr Kenyeres for her swift action in treating his impaired vision and preventing further deterioration by referring him to another specialist in Benoni. "The doctor and her team prioritised my case, providing the essential interventions that ultimately restored my vision," he said.

Gauteng Health ensures free access to condoms for



the public

The Gauteng Department of Health (GDoH) wishes to assure the public that free male and female condoms continue to be readily available at various locations including universities, clinics, taverns, hostels, hospitals, motels, brothels, workplaces, primary distribution sites, and key population hot spots areas. These facilities receive regular condom supplies based on their storage capacity, with deliveries occurring daily, weekly, or monthly.

Ms Maeshela Maheya from the HIV/AIDS, STI, and TB (HAST) unit at the GDoH pointed that the department aims to promote sexual health equity and eliminate barriers to condom use by making condoms accessible through health clinics, community centers, educational institutions, and outreach programs.

Non-Profit Organisations also play a vital role in the distribution of condoms to the community and have since prioritised key population hotspots to ensure that sex workers, people injecting drugs, and men having sex with men have access to condoms. Additionally, ward-based primary health outreach teams distribute condoms during their door-to-door visits on a daily basis.

"The active distribution of condoms is a critical component of public health strategies. It promotes sexual health, prevents STIs and unintended pregnancies, and empowers individuals to make informed choices about their sexual and reproductive well-being," said Maheya.

During the State of the Province Address (SOPA) debate, Health and Wellness MEC Nomantu Nkomo-Ralehoko highlighted the GDoH's efforts to educate students on critical topics such as teenage pregnancy, family planning methods, suicide prevention, sexual behavior, and sexually transmitted infections (STIs). This helps equip the youth with the knowledge to make informed decisions about their sexual health. In response to the recent increase in STI infections in the province, the GDoH has intensified efforts to emphasise the importance of condom use through public awareness campaigns. The public health team continues to conduct media interviews, share educational graphics on social media platforms, and organise educational programs at schools and community centers. These initiatives target both young people and adults, highlighting the significance of safe sex practices.

Through the Township, Informal Settlements and Hostel (TISH) outreach program, the department has increased the availability condoms to ensure that communities can access free males and females condoms in their neighborhood. Newly appointed district-based Mental Health Review Boards (MHRB) held their first quarterly review meeting on Thursday, 07 March since assuming office in December 2023 to serve for the next three years.

During the meeting with the MEC for Health and Wellness, Nomantu Nkomo-Ralehoko, held at Chris Hani Baragwanath Academic Hospital, the MHRB tabled quarterly reports (December 2023 to February 2024) from all five districts. The reports highlighted similar challenges faced by healthcare facilities in the province such as the need for dedicated vehicles for mental health

teams in each region for smooth facilitation of oversight visits to non-governmental organisations (NGOs) in different areas.

The importance of strengthening collaboration with NGOs in the province was also emphasised to enhance mental health services and overcome existing challenges.

The GDoH recognises the essential role played by NGOs in providing comprehensive mental health services and support to individuals in need. Collaborative efforts are vital in addressing the growing demand for mental health care services and overcoming the current challenges.

the expansion of wards for mental health patients across health facilities in the province.

Furthermore, the Department has been implementing various interventions to strengthen mental health care services, including increasing resources, such as mental health specialised professionals and rehabilitation services. Additionally, efforts have been made to refurbish and expand facilities to accommodate more acute mental health beds. By the end of the 2023/24 financial year, an additional 206 acute mental health beds will be added, at facilities such as Bertha Gxowa, South Rand, Tshwane District, Tembisa and Dr George Mukhari Academic, contributing to the current count of over 2,000 beds available in the province.

The Mental Health Review Boards are made up of 27 individuals with diverse expertise which include legal practitioners (attorneys and advocates), mental health care practitioners (doctors, psychiatric nurses, psychologists and social workers) and community members with a proven record of community development and involvement were appointed to serve in the province's five district-based for the next three years (01 December 2023 to 30 November 2026).
