2022 NSC EXAMS

- **10 days** from now, our Matric Class of 2022 will conclude their October/November National Senior Certificate (NSC) examinations
- On 7 December, candidates who could not complete the Computer Applications Technology (CAT) and Information Technology (IT) practical papers due to load shedding and other reasons will be given the opportunity to write these papers
- Although the NSC examinations have been going well in the province, there are few incidents that took place during the exam period

- Strikes/protests had no material significance to the examination process, exam continued as planned
- Absenteeism among part-time candidates is concerning
- We have a partnership with Childline Gauteng, candidates may call by dialing <u>116</u> for necessary counselling to cope during these exams





2022 NSC EXAM MARKING

Marking in Gauteng province is taking place in two sessions:

- Early session 17 to 27 November 2022
- Main session 07 to 20 December 2022
- 26 marking centres established to undertake marking of NSC scripts for the province
- We have **12 711** marking officials, including moderators, who are working tirelessly to capture marks
- We wish our officials well throughout the duration of the marking period, and thank them for their tireless efforts
- 30 more question papers to be written, we wish candidates well as they forge towards the finish line

PLACEMENT PROGRESS

- The Department is continuing to place Grade 1 & 8 learners who were applied for during the 2023 Online Admissions application period
- Although the placement period is expected to end on 30 November 2022, we want to assure parents that all learners will be placed in time for the 2023 academic year

PLACEMENT PROGRESS

- To date, total of <u>256 248 (87.71%) unique qualifying</u> <u>applicants have been placed</u>
 - Grade 1: 129 567
 - Grade 8: 126 681
- A total of <u>35 897 (12.29%) unique qualifying applicants</u> are unplaced
 - Grade 1: 9 897
 - Grade 8: 26 000





PLACEMENT OFFERS NOT ACCEPTED BY PARENTS

- A total of <u>5485</u> applicants who received offers of placement <u>have not accepted these offers</u> (Grade 1: 1868 and Grade 8: 3617)
- The system will auto-place all applicants with offers issued and not accepted by 30 November 2022





PLACEMENT OF UNPLACED APPLICANTS

- <u>NB:</u> Parents / guardians are reminded that ALL placement is subject to the priority of placement criteria and availability of space (capacity) per school
- Therefore, applicants that cannot be accommodated at the schools they applied to due to the schools having reached capacity, will receive transfer offers of placement at the next closest school with available space
- Transfer offers are made only after confirmation that none of the schools which a parent applied to has available space
- Parents / guardians who are offered placement at schools that they have not applied to have the option to accept or decline the placement offer





HIGH PRESSURE AREAS

- The Department has identified a number of highpressure areas where schools received an overwhelming number of applications which exceeds the capacity of learners that they can afford to accommodate:
 - About 313 Primary Schools are regarded as highpressure schools and
 - About 234 Secondary Schools are regarded as highpressure schools

INTERVENTIONS TO ASSIST HIGH PRESSURE SCHOOLS

- In order to assist high pressure schools to accommodate more learners, we will augment classroom shortages and enhance space by providing schools with mobile units and transferring funds to schools for self-build classroom projects
- This process will avail about 599 additional classrooms to Primary Schools and 698 additional classrooms to Secondary Schools
- We must emphasise that, with all these interventions, unfortunately it will not be possible to accommodate all applicants to schools they prefer however, all applicants will be placed at schools with available space





OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS

To allow a fair admission process, provision is made for Objections and Appeals:

- To submit an objection, the parent needs to decline the placement offer, and complete an electronic objection form online
- Objections must be submitted within 7 days of receiving the placement offer
- <u>NB</u>: when placement is offered at one of the schools that the parent applied to, objections and appeals are not applicable
- All objections are investigated on merit and an outcome is provided within 14 days of submission
- Applicants who decline the objection outcome may submit an appeal online within 7 days of receiving the objection outcome
- Appeals are processed and responded to within 14 21 days of receipt
- Parents must note that the Appeal outcome is final





INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS AND NO APPLICATIONS

- Only Applicants who submitted valid proof of residence will be placed from 03 October 2022 to 30 November 2022
- Applicants who submitted incomplete applications, will be placed at schools with available space between 1-15
 December 2022
- Applicants must finalise the placement at the school upon receipt of the SMS





GRADE 1 & 8 LATE APPLICATIONS

The GDE Online Admissions System will open for Late Applications

from 20 December 2022 to 20 January 2023

for parents who have not submitted any applications for Grade 1 and /or Grade 8
