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## 2023 NSC EXAMINATIONS

- The 2023 October/November National Senior Certificate (NSC) examination commences on **30 October 2023** and ends on **05 December 2023** with CAT and IT rewrites taking place on 06 December 2023
- GDE focus for 2023 is on Credibility, Integrity and Efficiency AND zero technical irregularities
- Qualifying candidates are required to **sign a pledge** before the exams commence as an indication of their commitment to the NSC Examination Code of Conduct

## 2023 NSC EXAMINATIONS - PREPARATION

- Candidates are reminded **not to disrupt** any examination proceedings while in the examination room, this will lead to immediate removal from the examination room and such candidates will be barred from continuing to write their examination paper
- Candidates are also reminded that if they are **found guilty of any act of dishonesty**, they will not only have their results nullified, but they will be barred from the stipulated number of future examination cycles depending on the severity of their dishonesty, candidates need to accept the dire consequences of their dishonesty and understand how it impacts on them being able to complete the NSC qualification

## PROFILE OF THE CLASS OF 2023

- The Class of 2023
  - Is the 16th cohort of learners to sit for the NSC qualification;
  - Is the 10th cohort to be exposed to the Curriculum and Assessment; Policy Statement (CAPS) introduced in 2014;
  - Entered the formal schooling system in Grade 1, in January 2012;
  - Was the 4th Grade 12 cohort to have been subjected to the global COVID-19 pandemic.

## PROFILE OF THE CLASS OF 2023

- This cohort has been subjected to disruptions in their schooling since Grade 9, before commencement with the FET phase in Grade 10 in 2021.
- It was the **6th cohort** to offer a series of new subjects in the Grade 12 NSC examinations.
- These include:
  - SASL HL, Technical Mathematics, Technical Science
  - 3 separate subject specializing in Civil, Electrical and Mechanical Technology

## EXAMINATION CENTRES

- GDE has registered a total of 1 015 examination centres:
  - 738 public centres
  - 277 independent centres
- This includes **93 centres activated** for Part-time/Repeater candidate.
- A total of **16 new centres** has been activated for this exam cycle.

## CANDIDATE REGISTRATION

- GDE has registered a total of 191 181 candidates to write the 2023 NSC Examination
  - 132 561 Full-time candidates
  - 58 620 Part-time/Repeater candidates
- This represents an overall decrease of 1.9 % (3 539 candidates) when compared to the 194 720 candidates registered for 2022
- The number of Full-time candidates has **dropped** by 6 310, while part-time/repeater candidates have **increased** by 2 771 for the 2023 NSC examination when compared to 2022-

- This is the first downward trend in enrolments since 2020, but remains significantly higher than across 2015 to 2020 where enrolments hovered around 150 000 candidates



## SECONDARY SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME (SSIP)

- Candidates were also assisted to prepare for these examinations by participating in the Secondary School Improvement Programme (SSIP) from September to October 2023.
- Candidates from different schools were also taken to SSIP residential camps for 1 a 2 weeks, where they were extensively assisted on different subjects
- Some schools conducted daily improvement programmes which also played a significant role in assisting candidates
- This programme has proven to be successful in assisting learner especially those who might have been severely impacted by different disruptions in their communities during the year

## INVIGILATION & MONITORING

- During training special attention was paid to the **checking of IDs** to eliminate fakes and the **verification of candidates' identity** to eliminate imposters
- Besides **cell phones** not being allowed in exam rooms, DBE has instructed that **no wrist watches** be allowed for the NSC 2023 examination either, this is to eliminate all possible means via which learners can access and/or share information digitally and online while writing their examination
- GDE has, in 2023, introduced the use of **super scanners** at examination centres to mitigate the smuggling in of cell phones
- The Department has appointed additional Chief Invigilators and Monitors to be stationed at high-risk centres (i.e. high enrolment centres, centres with history of irregularities, independent centres) during the conduct of the examination to take over or strengthen the management of the examination at the identified centres

## SECURITY INTERVENTIONS

- All high-level security mechanisms remain in place and have been augmented to mitigate any leakages of question papers, including strict adherence to norm times when collecting and returning examination material before and after examination writing sessions
- The department has appointed service providers to augment security in districts – these include armed escorts, response units, and CCTV cameras for the duration of the examination

## LOAD SHEDDING INTERVENTIONS

- During the audit of CAT and IT Laboratories, one of the areas of focus was on whether the centres have a generator to serve as back-up in the event of an electricity supply cut
- In the event we experience power cuts during CAT and IT practical examinations dates, a rewrite opportunity is provided on 06 December 2023 to candidates who might not be able to write on the scheduled dates
- Centres that do not have generators will procure and/or rent generators to avoid any disruptions that may result from a power cut
- The Department has also leased generators to ensure that back-up power is available for key processes such as marking and capturing to proceed during loadshedding

## MARKING

- Marking of the NSC 2023 scripts is scheduled to take place in two stages across a total of 25 Marking Centres:
  - Early session- 18 to 26 November 2023
  - Main session- 07 to 18 December 2023
- 14 065 markers have been appointed to ensure that marking is completed within the stipulated norm times, this is key to ensuring that all marking is timeously completed
- GDE will continue to engage in the e-marking process for Accounting Papers 1 and 2, and Mathematics Paper 2 and support the other 8 provinces in their e-marking of these papers as well

## PLACEMENT PERIOD

The 2024 Online Admissions Placement Period for Grade 1 and 8 commenced on 4 September 2023 and will continue throughout the remainder of the year until all learners are placed



## PLACEMENT CRITERIA RECAP

Parents and guardians are reminded that the placement offers are based on **the following criteria considered in order of priority below (NOT FIRST COME FIRST SERVED):**

- 1** Home address within the school's feeder zone
- 2** Sibling(s), Previous School
- 3** Work address within school's feeder zone
- 4** Home address within 30km radius
- 5** Home address beyond 30km radius

**Parents and guardians are also reminded that placement according to the above criteria is determined by the capacity at each school**

## UPDATE ON PLACEMENT PROGRESS

- It is important to note that the Department prioritises placement of the **273 186 (Grade 1: 144 240; Grade 8: 128 946)** applicants with complete applications
- I am pleased to announce that, to date, a total of **226 085 (82.8%) applicants are placed. This translates to 113 963 Grade 1: and 112 122 Grade 8** applicants placed six weeks after the commencement of the placement process
- A total of **6 747** applicants who **received placement offers have not accepted the placement offers**
- **47 101 (12.2%) unplaced** applicants, translating to **30 277 Grade 1 and Grade 8: 16 824** are in the process of being placed.
- **32 795 Applicants with Incomplete applications will be placed after all applicants with complete applications are placed**
- **However, parents that submitted documents manually and have proof that documents were submitted will be assisted to update their applications**



## PLACEMENT OFFERS

- Parents/Guardians with placement offers are urged to log on to [www.gdeadmissions.gov.za](http://www.gdeadmissions.gov.za) using their credentials to select one of the following two options accept an offer:
  - Accept Placement Offers As Final, Or
  - Accept placement offers while awaiting additional offers within 7 school days
- **Placement offers are reserved only until all the other schools applied to reach full capacity**
- As soon as all other schools that the parent applied to reach full capacity, **all applicants with placement offers are placed at the school that made the placement offer**
- To this end, the Department **auto-placed a total of 6627 Applicants with provisionally accepted offers on Friday, 20 October 2023**

## PLACEMENT OF UNPLACED APPLICANTS

- The Department is hard at work ensuring that the remaining **47 101 (Grade 1: 30 277; Grade 8: 16824) unplaced applicants are placed in due course**
- **NB:** Parents / guardians are reminded that ALL placement is subject to the priority of placement criteria and availability of space (capacity) per school
- The Department is in the process of setting up 8 satellite schools, delivering mobile classrooms and providing funds for schools to build additional classrooms to accommodate the unplaced applicants in high pressure areas
- Applicants that cannot be accommodated at schools they applied to due to the schools having reached capacity, will receive **transfer offers** of placement at the **next closest school with available space**

## TRANSFER OFFERS OF PLACEMENT

- Parents / guardians should expect transfer offers of placement from **Friday 27 October 2023**
- Transfer offers are made only after confirmation that none of the schools which a parent applied to has available space
- Parents / guardians who are offered placement at schools that they have not applied to have the option to accept or decline the placement offer
- When the transfer offer is accepted, the learner is placed at the school. The placement is final
- When the transfer offer is declined, the parent may submit an Objection within 7 days of receiving the transfer placement offer



## OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS

- Applicants who are **offered placement at schools that they have not applied to** have the option to accept or decline the placement offer
- To submit an objection, the parent declines the placement offer, and completes an electronic objection form online
- Objections must be submitted **within 7 days** of receiving the placement offer
- Note that **when placement is offered at one of the schools that the parent applied to, the parent will not be able to submit an objection or appeal**
- All objections are investigated on merit and an outcome is provided to the parent within 14 days of submission
- Applicants who **decline the objection outcome may submit an appeal** online within 7 days of receiving the objection outcome
- Appeals are processed and responded to within 14 – 21 days of receipt
- Parents need to note that the **Appeal outcome is final**

## **SCHOOLS AT FULL CAPACITY**

- Prior to the commencement of the placement period, **the Department conducted a capacity audit at all schools and to ensure that available capacity at all schools are used to optimally accommodate applicants**
- As at 23 October 2023, a total of **199 Primary schools reached full capacity after placing a total of 28 820 learners; And**
- **125 secondary schools reached full capacity after placing a total of 29 107 applicants**
- This means a **total of 324 schools have no more space to accommodate any further applicants**
- **Unplaced applicants that cannot be accommodated at these schools, will be transferred to the next closest school with available space**



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# ENSURING OPTIMAL PROVISION OF LEARNING SPACE

## HIGH PRESSURE SCHOOLS

- The Department has identified schools that received an overwhelming number of applications which exceeds the capacity of learners that they can afford to accommodate:
  - About **292** Primary Schools are regarded as high-pressure schools and
  - About **277** Secondary Schools are regarded as high-pressure schools
