2023 NSC EXAMS UPDATE

 It is comforting that we facilitated a successful 2023 NSC examination process, with limited challenges.

 With all preparations undertaken before this process, we are hopeful that candidates will provide Gauteng with outstanding results.





2023 NSC EXAMS UPDATE

- The 2023 October/November National Senior Certificate (NSC) examinations commenced on 30 October 2023 and concluded on 06 December 2023.
- The Gauteng Department of Education (GDE) facilitated examinations for a total of 188 074 candidates, comprising of:
 - 133 285 full-time (FT) candidates
 - 54 789 part-time/repeater (PT) candidates





INVIGILATION AND MONITORING

- We officially appointed invigilators and monitors who were trained prior to the start of the 2023 NSC examination, and they successfully monitored the process.
- Daily incident reports were submitted to the Department of Basic Education and Umalusi.





INVIGILATION AND MONITORING

 Weekly Quality Promotion (QP) meetings were held throughout the examination period, to review processes, sharing of practices, and necessary guidance from management and stakeholders.

 Reports from these meetings confirmed NSC examination credibility in Gauteng, meaning that, protocols were followed, policies adhered to, excellent security maintained, just on-time material distribution, and smooth collection schedules observed.





EXAMINATION DISTRIBUTION AND SECURITY

 Question papers were distributed and collected smoothly, with timely dissemination to exam venues, ensuring an overall successful process.





EXAMINATION IRREGULARITIES

- Few irregularities were reported in each week, however none of which could impact negatively the quality of examination. The were fifty-one (51) overall irregularities and incidences which comprised of the following:
 - a) 45 learners caught with crib notes,
 - b) 5 learners in possession of cell phones and;
 - c) 1 imposter.
- The vigilance of chief invigilators, invigilators and monitors was commendable, good administrative measures put in place by the Districts to manage irregularities was outstanding.





EXAMAMINATION IRREGULARITIES (CONT)

 Candidates need to be mindful that, if you are found to have transgressed the rules and regulations of the NSC examination, you might be barred from writing two to three examinations in the future.





EXAMINATION MARKING

- . Marking is divided into two sessions:
 - First session: commenced on November 16 to November 28, 2023, in specific schools.
 - Main marking: December 3 to December 20, 2023, across 25 undisclosed centers.
- 10 541 personnel appointed, including various roles like Chief Markers, Senior Markers, and monitors.
- Examination Assistants and Quality Assurers also appointed and allocated to centres to ensure smooth processes.
- Deputy Chief and Senior Markers were trained in November for both sessions.

2024 ONLINE ADMISSIONS APPLICATION PERIOD

The Gauteng Department of Education (GDE) wishes to announce that we are nearing the end of the 2024 Online Admissions for Grade 1 and 8 Placement Process.

It gives me great pleasure to inform you that to date, we have placed 99.8% of all complete applications and await only 0.1% of parents to accept their placement offers.

Placement of applicants commenced on 4 September 2023 and will close when all applicants are placed.

- A total of 32 795 parents applied without submitting any valid proof of home address
- To give parents an opportunity to finilise their applications, the Online Admissions
 Application System will be open from 11 December 2023 to 15 January 2023 to allow parents to select a school with available space
- Only ONE school may be selected for placement
- Placement at the selected school is final
- Documents may be submitted to selected school when schools reopen in January 2024





LATE APPLICATIONS

- To accommodate Late Applications, the Online Admissions Application system will be open from 18 December up to 31 January 2023
- Most important to note is that ONLY schools with available space will be available on the System. Note also that as each school becomes filled to capacity, it will be auto-removed. The choice of schools is therefore limited
- Parents are advised to select ONE school the learner will be auto-placed at the selected school
- Placement at the selected school is final
- Documents may be submitted to selected school when schools reopen in January 2024





OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS

- Applicants who are offered placement at schools that they have not applied to have the option to accept or decline the placement offer
- To submit an objection, the parent declines the placement offer, and completes an electronic objection form online
- Objections must be submitted within 7 days of receiving the placement offer
- Note that when placement is offered at one of the schools that the parent applied to, the parent will not be able to submit an objection or appeal
- All objections are investigated on merit and an outcome is provided to the parent within
 14 days of submission
- Applicants who decline the objection outcome may submit an appeal online within 7 days of receiving the objection outcome
- Appeals are processed and responded to within 14 21 days of receipt
- Parents need to note that the Appeal outcome is final

CAPACITY INTERVENTIONS

 To ensure that all learners are placed, the GDE has embarked on the following interventions to increase capacity:

Mobile Units:

 A total of 341 mobile units have been delivered to Primary and Secondary Schools across the province





CAPACITY INTERVENTIONS

Self-build programme:

- Within this programme, the GDE has allocated funding to highpressure schools to build a total of 1 745
 additional classrooms to augment their capacity
- The process to transfer the said funds to about 606 schools is at an advanced stage
- All identified schools are guided on how to commence with the procurement process to appoint constructors accordingly

2024 SCHOOL READINESS

- In addition to the previously mentioned infrastructural and capacity interventions that Gauteng has in place for the 2024 academic year:
- We have planned on transporting 210 000 learners from the start of the 2024 academic year and increasing the number of existing pick-up points
- We will continue to provide food to learners at deserving schools, being prepared to provide nutrition for approximately 1 679 876 learners in the 2024 academic year
- Learning and Teaching Support Material (LTSM) in the form of textbooks, stationery, workbooks and classroom furniture will be provided. Schools with challenges in these areas, particularly with furniture, have been identified and these will have been addressed by the start of the 2024 academic year

FURNITURE PROVISION

- The provisioning school furniture has a direct effect on teaching and learning in schools
- Shortage of furniture in schools has a negative impact towards the realisation of quality education
- Accordingly, about R170m additional budget has been approved for the period 2023/2024 to alleviate pressures experienced by the department.
- About 588 Primary and 259 Secondary Schools and 169 Mobile classes received furniture during this period





HUMAN RESOURCES

- 849 Funza Lushaka Graduates received for placement in GDE schools in 2023. A total of 398 unplaced graduates from the list will be considered for placement in 2024.
- All Funza Lushaka graduates are required to register on the Unemployed Educator database.
- A new Funza Lushaka provisional placement list for the 2024 academic year is expected from DBE.
- The Department has allocated a total of 45 posts (3 per District), for the appointment of TEACH SA ambassadors to teach Maths, Science, Technology and English in under performing schools – their contracts will expire on 31 December 2024.
- There are 68 000 unemployed educators that are registered on the educator unemployment database. All principals have access to the database through HRP officials and uses it for the recruitment processes and filling of vacant posts
- 110 Principal posts were advertised through the Vacancy circular 11/2023(see summary below per district)
- Note that the preferred assumption of duty is 1 July 2024, the reason for the late assumption of duty, is to allow the SGB elections to take place and for new SGBs to do the recruitment process for the school principal. The shortlisting and Interviews will be between April and June 2024.





2024 OPENING OF SCHOOLS EXCO DEPLOYMENT

- The Opening of Schools Campaign undertaken by the Executive Council the importance of education and why it remains the apex priority of the province and the country.
- Members of the Executive Council will conduct oversight monitoring of the overall readiness of schools on the first day of re-opening (17 January 2024) as part of Government's commitment to Education.

These oversight visits to schools send a clear message that the Gauteng Provincial Government supports:

- Making education an apex priority, and
- The non-negotiables, namely:
 - All learners are in class, on time, learning with the necessary stationery and textbooks.
 - All educators are in class, on time, teaching with the correct resources.
