The Gauteng Department of Roads and Transport adhere to all relevant Acts including, the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa of 1996, the Black Economic Empowerment Act No.53 of 2003, Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No.5 of 2000, Employment Equity Act No. 55 of 1998 and the Public Finance Management Act No 1 of 1999.

Gauteng Department of Roads and Transport will apply the 90/10 preference point system in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2017.

## PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA FOR PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT

Bidders who do not meet the pre-qualification criteria below will be disqualified and will not be considered further in the evaluation process:

Bidders (including a trust, JV's and consortia) must have a level 1 or 2 B-BBEE Status Level.

- Bidders who do NOT qualify as Exempted Micro Enterprises (EME's) or Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSE's) must submit B-BBEE Status Level verification certificates which have been prepared by an agency that is accredited by SANAS (South African National Accreditation System).
- A Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSE) which is at least 51% black owned is required to submit a sworn affidavit confirming their annual total revenue of between R10 million and R50 million and level of black ownership to claim points as prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2017.
- A Qualifying Small Enterprise (QSE) which is less than 51% black owned is required to submit a B-BBEE Status Level verification certificate which is accredited by SANAS including a sworn affidavit confirming their annual total revenue of between R10 million and R50 million and level of black ownership to claim points as prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2017.
- An Exempted Micro Enterprise (EME) is required to submit a sworn affidavit confirming their annual total revenue of R10 million or less and level of black ownership to claim points as prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2017.

Affidavits submitted by bidders in support of their B-BBEE level should comply with the format prescribed by the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition (DTIC) and the Companies and Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC).

Bidders are hereby advised that the Department shall examine and verify the authenticity of B-BBEE claims made by bidders.

Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) requires that bidders submit original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof to substantiate their B-BBEE rating claims. All trusts, consortia and joint ventures must obtain and submit a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate. Failure to do so will result in the bidder being disqualified. Public entities and tertiary institutions must also submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates together with their bids.

**NOTE**: Sworn Affidavits and certification as a "true copy of the original", must comply with the requirements outlined in the Justices of the Peace and Commissioners of Oaths Act, No 16 of 1963 and its Regulations promulgated in Government Notice GNR 1258 of 21 July 1972 Justices of the Peace and Commissioners of Oaths Act, No. 16 of 1963.

## Sub-Contracting as a condition of tender

The Bidder must sub-contract a minimum of 30% of the value of the contract to one or more of the categories as stipulated in section 9(2)(1)(b) - 9(2)(1)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017.

The Bidder must attach (as part of the submission) a copy/ies of the sub-contractor's sworn affidavit (certified by a Commissioner of Oaths) confirming their B-BBEE Status Level of contribution and annual total revenue including a signed subcontracting agreement.

Those sub-contractors who will be involved in the execution of construction works shall be registered with the CIDB and the value of their sub-contracts must be in line with their respective CIDB grading (proof of CIDB grading to be attached for each sub-contractor), except sub-contractors who are not eligible for CIDB grading.

A signed subcontracting agreement specifying the following must be included in bidder submissions:

- scope of work with total financial amounts allocated.
- the percentage of work allocated to each party in relation to the total scope of work.
